

What Do I Do With ... ?

While you can dispose of lots of plastic and paper in your regular curbside recycling collection, not everything is accepted. If you aren't sure how to dispose of something, check the list below for assistance.

Please remember that while many items are collected at the Wachusett Watershed Regional Recycling Center with no charge, some items do incur a fee. Cardboard (cereal boxes, shipping boxes, waxed cardboard, corrugated cardboard, etc.)	Curbside Collection
Construction or Renovation Waste (carpet, wallboard, bricks, insulation, sinks, doors, etc.)	Wachusett Watershed Regional Recycling Center
