MONTHLY CMRPHA UPDATES December 2018

ADMINISTRATION (ADM)

- **Duty Officer Number** Reminder that the Duty Officer Pager System is in place for after hours and weekend emergencies. Please make sure that appropriate parties have the number, which is **508-408-5173**. This should be the process instead of calling specific environmental health staff cell phones after hours. **PLEASE ENSURE YOUR DISPATCH FOR ALL SHIFTS HAS THIS NUMBER AND ARE FAMILIAR WITH THE ON PAGE PROCESS AND CMRPHA.**
- **Regional Community Health Improvement Plan** On November 29th, the Coalition for a Healthy Greater Worcester and the Worcester Division of Public Health, along with many key partners, reported on CHIP progress to date (2016 2017) to an audience of 200 people from across the region at the Worcester Boys and Girls Club. - **Coalition for a Healthy Greater Worcester** The Coalition represents one of MA DPH's Community Health Network Areas (CHNAs) and is the accountability and implementation arm for the CHIP. - **Hepatitis A Outbreak** a press release was issued to the Alliance on Friday about an outbreak of Hepatitis A in the City of Worcester. We are encouraging individuals who are experiencing homelessness and / or substance use to get vaccinated. We are also encouraging those organizations who work with this population to also encourage these individuals to get vaccinated. MDPH is reporting an uptick in Worcester and Boston areas.







• **Cremation of Unclaimed Bodies** – in July 2018, the Commonwealth amended a law that allows for cremation of certain unclaimed bodies. In late November, WDPH Medical Director and other staff met with representatives from UMass Memorial to discuss the number of unclaimed bodies in the Memorial and University Campus morgues. The City Law Department will be researching if other local Boards of Health have adopted a local regulation that requires a waiver for funeral homes to cremate. Thus far, and to our knowledge, very few funeral homes in the area have provided burials at no cost. More research needs to be done to determine if this is a statewide issue (lack of funeral homes providing this service gratis).

ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH (EH)

- The adoption of the 2013 Federal Food Code is now official as on October 5th. You can go online to ma.gov/dph/fpp for a link to the Merged Food Code and other info.
- The EH team and Worcester Inspectional Services Team will be having an in house training on the changes in the new food code.
- Michael Mendez and Abby Graham both finished and passed the Title V Soil Evaluator training. Both are now officially Certified Soil Evaluators. Congratulations to both of them for their continued effort and ongoing training in the environmental health field.

Lifeskills is an evidence based prevention curriculum that helps young people to learn how to make good decisions concerning their health such as refusing drugs.
- November 30th Nikki Nixon and Cassandra Andersen presented Youth Health Survey data on trends in Marijuana use at the Youth and Drugs Conference hosted by the Worcester Public Schools
