LEGAL ADVERTISEMENTS: Fee includes cost of Telegram and Gazette advertisement and Conservation Commission administrative costs: **\$70.00**

REQUEST FOR DETERMINATION (RDA):

Application fee: **\$95.00**

Add legal advertisement fee (see above):

Wetlands Determination, if contracted by Conservation Commission: **\$1.00/linear foot**

NOTICE OF INTENT:

Usual and customary costs including, but not limited to, engineering, delineations, legal advice as deemed necessary by a majority vote of the Commission. Town fee = half of total fee, add \$12.50.

Fees to State = half of total fee, subtract \$12.50.

CERTIFICATE OF COMPLIANCE:

Administrative fee only (no legal ad required): **\$95.00**

ENFORCEMENT ORDER:

All incurred costs, plus 30%, including but not limited to: certified mail, administrative labor costs, legal consultant fees, wetlands delineation, engineering, etc. – **Add additional \$25.00 Administrative Fee**

SEWER HOOK-UP FEES:

For all residents who do not file an application to hook-up within six months of sewer availability, a fee will be incurred for either a Request for Determination or Notice of Intent, if applicable. **\$95.00**

BUILDING PERMIT APPLICATIONS: (Per Review): **\$95.00**

If delineation is necessary, then applicant must file a Request for Determination.

****Note: applicant is responsible for any recording fees, and must report recording of documents to the Conservation Commission.**

(These fees are used to defray administrative costs for the West Boylston Conservation Commission.
