TOWN OF WEST BOYLSTON CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) UPDATE MARCH 25, 2020

Today, March 25, 2020, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Board of Health, with the support of the Select Board and Town Administrator has directed the closure of Town Hall to the public until further notice. The Library and Senior Center closed earlier this week. The Police Station, Fire Department, DPW, and West Boylston Municipal Light Department offices are also closed to the public. Municipal Employees will continue to report to work.

Accordingly, all town activities/programs are cancelled, as well. This decision is being made from an abundance of caution to attempt to limit in-person contact while also continuing to provide basic services to residents and business owners. The Town has taken the necessary steps to cancel non-essential government meetings.

While we certainly understand this situation is not ideal, we are proceeding with the well-being of our citizens and staff in mind. We encourage everyone to closely follow information from the Massachusetts Department of Health (DPH), West Boylston Board of Health, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and exercise good judgement and caution.

We are asking that the public use our on-line resources for on-line payment and contact us via email and telephone with any questions that you may have for us. Residents are encouraged to use the on-line permitting application and the drop box in the front of the Town Hall building, as well as the Fire Station for bill payment or any other documents that would normally be delivered personally.

Assessor's Office

- The Assessors' Office will continue to process motor vehicle excise abatement's. Applications are available online at Assessors Department web page, under forms and documents, (Motor Vehicle Excise Abatement Form) <u>https://www.westboylston-ma.gov</u>
- Documentation may be sent via USPS, emailed to <u>assessors@westboylston-ma.gov</u>, 140 Worcester Street or placed in the drop box @ Town Hall.
- Call the office or email with any questions regarding personal exemptions.
- Real and Personal Property abatement's that were received within the required time frame will continue to be processed.

Treasurer/Collector's Office

- To make payments for excise please call the office for updated amount and mail in or drop off payment to our drop off box outside the Town Hall building.

- The payment drop box continues to be available 24/7 in the front of Town Hall building.
- When making out check(s), please make it payable to the Town of West Boylston.
- If you would like a receipt for your payment mailed back to you, please include your whole bill and a self-addressed stamped envelope with your check(s).
- If you have received an excise tax bill for a vehicle that you no longer own, please fill out the abatement form on the back of the bill and send it back to the Assessor's office with the required documents.

Senior Center / COA

- The Senior Center is closed for activities and programs.
- Staff and volunteers are available to provide meals on wheels, take-out meals for our more vulnerable congregate lunch participants, transportation services, outreach services and other services deemed necessary as a result of the pandemic.

DPW / Highway/Water/Cemeteries

- Incoming calls for tree issues, potholes, etc. can be placed to the DPW office at 508-835-4820.
- The Water Dept. will perform reads for those remote or drive by meters. If there is a situation that presents itself as an emergency only then will the water department enter the home or building.
- The payment drop box available in front of the West Boylston Town Hall 140 Worcester Street.
- Cemetery burials and Sale of Lots will occur as needed while considering weather conditions.

- The pink Bag Program has been cancelled until further notice.

Fire Inspections

 Burn Permits will no longer be issued at the fire station. To get a Burn Permit, please go to our website <u>https://wboylston.burnpermits.com/</u>

- Permit Applications and other correspondence will not be received in person at the Fire Station. Please send them to us by U.S. Mail to West Boylston Fire Department 39 Worcester, Street, West Boylston, MA 01583.
- Realtors and other people selling residential property should anticipate delays in 26F/26F ½ (smoke and CO detector) inspections associated with real estate transactions. If possible, closing dates should be scheduled after April 15 to minimize this impact on real estate closings.
- The WBFD Business office will be staffed and reachable by phone at 774-450-3520. Please feel free to call us to get help with any issues with permits, inspections, EMS billing or other non-emergency business. You can also contact us via email using the links provided on our website.
- All meetings and trainings scheduled at the fire station have been postponed.
- As always, if you have an emergency please call 911 and we will respond immediately.

Police Department

- Until further notice, we are asking citizens to avoid coming into the lobby of the police department, unless it is a case of an emergency.
- We will be temporarily allowing our officers to take reports over the phone for any issues or incidents that we feel would not require a visit to your home. Some examples could be neighbor disputes/civil matters, calls for advice, credit card/identity theft, and animal matters that are not a threat to public safety.
- No citizen fingerprints will be taken at the station until further notice.
- If you have a situation that can be resolved over the phone by speaking with a police officer, please call our business line at 774-450-3510. Please continue to use 911 for all emergencies and medical calls.

• **Outdoor Facilities:** At this time all playgrounds and parks have been closed, this includes outdoor tennis and basketball courts as well.

Government Meetings

Only essential meetings are to take place with remote participation in keeping with Governor Baker's March 15, 2020 order limited gatherings to 25 and now limited to 10 or less persons per Federal guidelines. Conference call information will be added to the posted meeting agendas so that the public may participate in these meetings, as much as possible. Agendas will continue to be posted on the Town's website.

As a reminder:

- Take every day precautionary actions to avoid the spread of respiratory viruses like the flu and COVID-19, such as washing your hands frequently for 20 seconds with soap and warm water (or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer when soap and water are not available), avoiding people who are sick, avoiding touching your eyes, nose or mouth, and covering your cough or sneeze with a tissue.
- People who are sick should stay home and not go into crowded public places or visit people in hospitals.
- Anyone who is experiencing a fever and/or respiratory illness and is concerned they have either come into contact with the virus or traveled to an affected country within the last 14 days is advised to contact their primary health care provider.
- Practice social distancing at all times
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces daily. This includes tables, doorknobs, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards, toilets, faucets, and sinks. If surfaces are dirty, clean them: Use detergent or soap and water prior to disinfection.
- Get the flu vaccine.
