## The Situation...And Why You Should Care

- Each American gets rid of 80 lbs of clothing per year
- In MA, residents and businesses throw away more than 250,000 tons of textiles and apparel each year.
  - 95 percent of this textile waste could have been readily recovered for productive reuse instead of being put in landfills or incinerated.
- West Boylston incurs a cost of \$79 per ton for solid waste tip fees.
- In general municipalities and businesses pay about \$16 million to send textiles to landfills and waste combustors.
  - Putting textiles in your trash could mean higher costs for trash and recycling to the town.

#### What Textiles Can be Recycled?

- Clothing, scarves, hats, gloves
- Sheets, blankets, pillowcases, towels, tablecloths, curtains
- Shoes, socks, belts, backpacks
- Stuffed animals
  - All these items are okay even if ripped, stained, missing buttons, broken zippers, holes, etc.
  - Have to be dry and reasonably clean



### Misconceptions...and Solutions

- I thought donated clothing and textiles had to be in good condition...
  - As long as items aren't wet, moldy, or soaked in oil or hazardous materials, they can go in donation bag.
    - FYI: Torn or stained items that can't be resold are baled and sold on the global commodities market or consumed locally by textile converters to make wiping rags or insulation and padding products.
