# Seasonal Message from the DPW Director



## Winter Stormwater Stewardship

Salt and sand used to de-ice driveways and sidewalks keeps us from falling. However, stormwater runoff flowing down streets and over land can collect winter sand, road salt, and more. What goes into our storm drains goes directly into water bodies and carries whatever pollutants it may pick up along the way. Too much salt or sand can pollute our waterways.

## Things You Can Do to Protect Water Quality and Prevent Pollution

- Salt **before the storm** to prevent ice.
- Remove snow **manually** before applying any salt or sand.
- Apply salt and sand **sparingly**.
- Clean up any **extra or spilled** salt and sand.
- Store salt and de-icing chemicals **carefully**, away from drinking water supplies.
- Do not dispose of snow in waterbodies.
- Select **non-toxic** de-icing products.
